"Through biology I lost my faith in creation; through religion, my faith in the Bible; through sociology, my faith in the family; through psychology, my faith in myself; through philosophy, my faith in God."

Another student came to school, disillusioned by the teaching that his good works would get him to Heaven. His search led him to a CBF Bible study, where he learned that only faith in Christ's completed work will bring salvation; he left that study a new creature in Christ.
